AN ACT

Concerning the Admission of Children under Fifteen
Years to Shows and Places of Amusement.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Whoever, by himself or his ser-
2 vant or agent, admits any child under the age of
3 fifteen years to any public show or amusement,
4 unless said child is accompanied by parent or
5 guardian, shall be punished by fine not exceeding
6 one hundred dollars; but this shall not apply to
7 shows and amusements which take place before
8 sunset.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
