AN ACT

To authorize the Commissioners of Prisons to remove Prisoners from the Massachusetts Reformatory to the State Workhouse and giving the State Board of Lunacy and Charity authority over Prisoners so removed.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The commissioners of prisons may
2 remove from the Massachusetts reformatory to
3 the state workhouse any prisoner held in said
4 reformatory, and a prisoner so removed shall
5 serve in said workhouse the remainder of his
6 original term of sentence.

1 SECT. 2. The state board of lunacy and char-
2 ity shall have the same authority to release from
3 said workhouse a prisoner so removed, and to

4 return him thereto for a violation of the conditions
5 upon which he was released, that the commis-
6 sioners of prisons would have had to release him
7 from said reformatory, and to return him thereto,
8 if he had not been so removed.
