AN ACT

Prescribing the Maximum and Minimum Fees for
Liquor Licenses.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section eleven of chapter one
2 hundred of the Public Statutes is hereby amended
3 so as to read as follows: —
4 *Sect. 11.* The fees for licenses shall be as fol-
5 lows: For a license of the first class, not more
6 than fifteen hundred dollars nor less than five hun-
7 dred dollars. For a license of the second or
8 third class, not more than five hundred dollars nor
9 less than two hundred and fifty dollars. For a
10 license of the fourth class, not more than seven
11 hundred dollars nor less than five hundred dollars.

12 For a license of the fifth class, not more than three
13 hundred dollars nor less than one hundred and
14 fifty dollars; provided that a brewer shall pay not
15 less than four hundred dollars. For a license of
16 the sixth class, not more than one hundred and
17 fifty dollars nor less than fifty dollars.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon the
2 first day of July, A. D. eighteen hundred and
3 eighty-seven.
