Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Eighty-seven.

AN ACT

In Further Addition to the Several Acts making Appropriations for Expenses authorized the Present Year, and for Certain Other Expenses authorized by Law.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned
2 are appropriated to be paid out of the treasury
3 of the Commonwealth, from the ordinary rev-
4 enue, for the purposes specified in certain acts
5 and resolves of the present year, and to meet
6 certain other expenses authorized by law, to wit:—
7 For Austin C. Wellington, the sum of two
8 hundred dollars, as authorized by chapter sixty-
9 two of the resolves of the present year.
10 For Carney hospital, in the city of Boston, to
11 aid in the erection of additional permanent build-
12 ings, the sum of ten thousand dollars, as author-
13 ized by chapter sixty-three of the resolves of the
14 present year.

15 For the purchase of land for the use of the
16 Massachusetts school for the feeble-minded, a
17 sum not exceeding twenty thousand dollars, as
18 authorized by chapter sixty-four of the resolves
19 of the present year.

20 For Roberts Brothers, the sum of two thou-
21 sand five hundred dollars, as authorized by chap-
22 ter sixty-five of the resolves of the present year.

23 For the construction of a coal-shed and the
24 purchase of laundry machinery, and for certain
25 repairs and improvements at the Massachusetts
26 reformatory at Concord, a sum not exceeding six
27 thousand seven hundred dollars, as authorized by
28 chapter sixty-nine of the resolves of the present
29 year.

30 For Owen McAuliff of Hingham, the sum of
31 three hundred and seven dollars and fifty cents,
32 as authorized by chapter seventy of the resolves
33 of the present year.

34 For the town of Groveland, the sum of thir-
35 teen hundred and one dollars, as authorized by
36 chapter seventy-two of the resolves of the pres-
37 ent year.

38 For the construction of a reservoir, for the
39 purchase of a hose and carriage, and for new fur-
40 naces at the state industrial school for girls, a
41 sum not exceeding seven thousand dollars, as
42 authorized by chapter seventy-four of the resolves
43 of the present year.

44 For the town of Milford, the sum of fourteen
45 hundred and seventy-nine dollars and fifty cents,
46 as authorized by chapter seventy-seven of the
47 resolves of the present year.

48 For John L. Mayers, the sum of one hundred
49 dollars, as authorized by chapter seventy-eight of
50 the resolves of the present year.

51 For the widow of the late John K. Tarbox,
52 the sum of seventeen hundred and fifty dollars,
53 as authorized by chapter eighty of the resolves
54 of the present year.

55 For continuing the preparation for publication
56 of a list of Massachusetts officers, sailors and
57 marines, a sum not exceeding two thousand dol-
58 lars, as authorized by chapter eighty-one of the
59 resolves of the present year, being in addition to
60 the fifteen hundred dollars appropriated by chap-
61 ter three of the acts of the present year.

62 For the completion of the decennial census of
63 the year eighteen hundred and eighty-five, a sum
64 not exceeding three thousand five hundred dol-
65 lars, being in addition to the seventeen thousand
66 dollars appropriated by chapter one of the acts
67 of the present year. [Acts 1884, chap. 181.]

68 For the payment of rent of rooms in Ticknor
69 building, adjoining the census office in Claffin
70 building, for storage purposes for the bureau of
71 statistics of labor, a sum not exceeding five hun-
72 dred dollars.

73 For the purpose of exterminating contagious
74 diseases among horses, cattle and other animals,
75 a sum not exceeding two thousand dollars, being
76 in addition to the five thousand dollars appro-
77 priated by chapter nine of the acts of the pres-
78 ent year. [Pub. Stat., chap. 90; Acts 1885, chap.
79 378.]

80 For the salary of the clerk of the supreme
81 judicial court for the county of Suffolk, the sum
82 of nine hundred and twenty-eight dollars and
83 forty-two cents, as authorized by chapter two
84 hundred and ninety-one of the acts of the present
85 year.

86 For the payment of salaries at the reformatory
87 prison for women at Sherborn, the sum of seven
88 hundred dollars, as authorized by chapter three
89 hundred and forty-one of the acts of the present
90 year, being in addition to the twenty-three thou-
91 sand dollars appropriated by chapter ten of the
92 acts of the present year.

93 For the salary of the deputy tax commissioner,
94 the sum of one hundred and forty-five dollars
95 and eighty-three cents, as authorized by chapter
96 three hundred and forty-two of the acts of the
97 present year, being in addition to the two thou-
98 sand seven hundred and fifty dollars appropriated
99 by chapter one of the acts of the present year.

100 For the salary of the first clerk of the tax
101 commissioner, one hundred and sixteen dollars
102 and sixty-seven cents, as authorized by chapter
103 three hundred and forty-two of the acts of the
104 present year, being in addition to the eighteen
105 hundred dollars appropriated by chapter one of
106 the acts of the present year.

107 For the salary of the second clerk of the tax
108 commissioner, one hundred and sixteen dollars
109 and sixty-seven cents, as authorized by chapter
110 three hundred and forty-two of the acts of the
111 present year, being in addition to the thirteen

112 hundred dollars appropriated by chapter one of
113 the acts of the present year.

114 For such additional clerical assistance as the
115 tax commissioner and commissioner of corpora-
116 tions may find necessary, a sum not exceeding
117 two thousand dollars, as authorized by chapter
118 three hundred and forty-two of the acts of the
119 present year, being in addition to the twelve
120 thousand dollars appropriated by chapter one of
121 the acts of the present year.

122 For improving the sewerage of the state
123 normal school building and boarding-hall at
124 Westfield, a sum not exceeding five thousand
125 two hundred dollars, as authorized by chapter
126 three hundred and sixty-nine of the acts of the
127 present year.

128 For aiding prisoners discharged from the
129 Massachusetts reformatory, a sum not exceeding
130 two thousand dollars, as authorized by chapter
131 three hundred and ninety-five of the acts of the
132 present year, being in addition to the three thou-
133 sand dollars appropriated by chapter ten of the
134 acts of the present year.

135 For expenses of the railroad commissioners
136 made necessary by chapter three hundred and
137 thirty-four of the acts of the present year,
138 relating to the examination of railroad bridges,
139 a sum not exceeding four thousand dollars,
140 being in addition to the four thousand two hun-
141 dred and fifty dollars appropriated by chapter
142 nine of the acts of the present year.

143 For the salary of the adjutant-general, the

144 sum of three hundred and twenty-nine dollars,
145 as authorized by chapter four hundred and
146 eleven of the acts of the present year, being in
147 addition to the three thousand dollars appro-
148 priated by chapter one of the acts of the present
149 year.

150 For replenishing the library at the state
151 prison, a sum not exceeding two thousand dol-
152 lars, as authorized by chapter eighty-four of the
153 resolves of the present year.

154 For the soldiers' messenger corps, a sum not
155 exceeding eight hundred dollars, as authorized
156 by chapter eighty-five of the resolves of the
157 present year.

158 For repairs and a trunk elevator at the normal
159 school at Framingham, a sum not exceeding five
160 thousand one hundred and seventy-five dollars,
161 as authorized by chapter eighty-eight of the
162 resolves of the present year.

163 For Martha L. Blake and Caroline Blake, the
164 sum of one hundred dollars, as authorized by
165 chapter eighty-nine of the resolves of the
166 present year.

167 For protection against fire of the stairs and
168 stairways of the reformatory prison for women,
169 a sum not exceeding four thousand dollars, as
170 authorized by chapter ninety-two of the resolves
171 of the present year.

172 For the centennial celebration of the signing
173 of the constitution of the United States, a sum
174 not exceeding forty thousand dollars, as author-
175 ized by chapter ninety-three of the resolves of
176 the present year.

177 For expenses of a commissioner or delegate
178 to a national convention on prison labor, a sum
179 not exceeding three hundred dollars, as author-
180 ized by chapter ninety-four of the resolves of
181 the present year.

182 For expenses in connection with investigations
183 into the disposal of sewage in the Mystic and
184 Charles river valleys, a sum not exceeding ten
185 thousand dollars, as authorized by chapter
186 ninety-five of the resolves of the present year.

187 For the erection of a new building at the state
188 prison at Boston, a sum not exceeding twenty
189 thousand dollars, as authorized by chapter
190 ninety-six of the resolves of the present year.

191 For the purchase of uniforms, equipments and
192 military supplies for the volunteer militia, a sum
193 not exceeding seventy-eight thousand dollars, as
194 authorized by chapter ninety-eight of the re-
195 solves of the present year.

196 For reprinting certain documents and for re-
197 placing paper destroyed by fire at the state
198 printers, a sum not exceeding five thousand
199 dollars, as authorized by chapter ninety-nine of
200 the resolves of the present year.

201 For extra repairs and improvements in and
202 furniture for the state house, a sum not exceed-
203 ing ten thousand dollars, as authorized by chap-
204 ter one hundred of the resolves of the present
205 year.

206 For indexing house journals under the direc-
207 tion of the clerk of the house, as authorized by
208 an order adopted June sixteenth, eighteen hun-

209 dred and eighty-seven, a sum not exceeding two
210 thousand dollars.

211 For additional fire protection, a carriage house
212 and certain other improvements at the Westbor-
213 ough insane hospital, a sum not exceeding forty-
214 nine thousand eight hundred and twenty-five
215 dollars, as authorized by chapter one hundred
216 and one of the resolves of the present year.

217 For the New England industrial school for
218 deaf-mutes, the sum of two thousand dollars,
219 as authorized by chapter one hundred and two
220 of the resolves of the present year.

221 For the Massachusetts institute of technology,
222 the sum of fifty thousand dollars, as authorized
223 by chapter one hundred and three of the resolves
224 of the present year.

225 For Walter Shanly, the sum of seventy-nine
226 thousand four hundred and ninety-five dollars
227 and sixty-two cents, as authorized by chapter
228 one hundred and five of the resolves of the
229 present year.

230 For the payment of bounties to certain
231 veterans of the town of Acton, the sum of three
232 thousand eight hundred and seventy-five dol-
233 lars, as authorized by chapter one hundred and
234 six of the resolves of the present year.

235 For the widow of Frederick C. S. Bartlett,
236 the sum of seven hundred and fifty dollars, as
237 authorized by a resolve of the present year.

238 For the benefit of the hospital cottages in
239 Baldwinsville in the town of Templeton, the
240 sum of ten thousand dollars, as authorized by
241 an act of the present year.

242 For ballot boxes for cities and towns to vote
243 on the question of granting licenses for the sale
244 of liquor, a sum not exceeding twenty-eight
245 thousand dollars, as authorized by an act of the
246 present year.

247 For salaries of the controller and clerks and
248 office expenses, established by an act passed the
249 present year, a sum not exceeding four thousand
250 dollars, and for necessary travelling expenses of
251 said officers, a sum not exceeding eight hundred
252 dollars.

253 For expenses under the act relating to the
254 labor of prisoners in the prisons and houses of
255 correction of the Commonwealth, a sum not
256 exceeding twenty-five thousand dollars, as auth-
257 orized by an act passed the present year.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
