RESOLUTIONS

Requesting Congress to pass a Law granting Pensions to every honorably discharged Union Soldier or Sailor who was confined in Rebel Prisons.

1 *Resolved*, By the honorable Senate and House of
2 Representatives of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts,
3 that the honorable Senate and House of Representatives
4 of the United States are requested by the General Court
5 of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts to pass a law
6 that all honorably discharged Union soldiers and sailors
7 of the late war, who were confined in rebel prisons, be
8 placed on the pension rolls of the United States, at not
9 less than twelve dollars per month, and that they receive
10 the sum of two dollars per day for the time they were
11 so imprisoned.

12 *Resolved*, That the governor of the Commonwealth of
13 Massachusetts forward a copy of this resolution to the
14 Senate and House of Representatives of the United
15 States.
