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### AN ACT

Amending Section Thirty-Four of Chapter Twenty-Seven of the Public Statutes relative to the Keepers of Lock-ups.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section thirty-four of chapter twenty-seven of  
2 the Public Statutes is hereby amended so as to  
3 read as follows: *Sect. 34.* Such keepers shall  
4 have the powers of police officers, with such  
5 compensation, to be paid by the town, as may be  
6 fixed by the selectmen at the time of their  
7 appointment.
