AN ACT TO EXTEND THE POLICE POWERS FOR EMPLOYEES AT STATE AND COMMUNITY COLLEGES HOLDING SPECIAL STATE POLICE OFFICER POWERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES

Article I, Section 1, Clause 1
