AN ACT TO PLACE CERTAIN JOB TITLES IN THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT UNDER THE CIVIL SERVICE SYSTEM.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 The following positions in the Department of Environmental
- 2 Management shall be made permanent positions:—
- 3 Recreational Facility Supervisor 2, 3, and 4, Recreational
- 4 Facility Repairer, Supervisor Rink and Pool, Forest and Park
- 5 Regional Coordinator and Laborer 1.
- 6 These permanent positions shall then be placed under Chap-
- 7 ter 31 of the Massachusetts General Laws.
- 8 Incumbents who have served in the above-cited positions for
- 9 two years or more and whose positions are allocated to the official
- 10 service, shall be subjected to a qualifying examination, and if
- 11 he/she passes, shall be deemed a tenured employee without
- 12 serving any probationary period.
- 13 An incumbent in a position allocated to the labor service
- 14 employed for two years or more shall be deemed to be a tenured
- 15 employee without serving any probationary period.
- 16 An incumbent of a position allocated to the official service who
- 17 has been employed less than two years shall be subjected to a
- 18 qualifying examination and if he/she passes, shall be deemed to be
- 19 a tenured employee after serving a probationary period.
- 20 An incumbent of a position allocated to the labor service who
- 21 has been employed less than two years shall be deemed a tenured
- 22 employee after serving a probationary period.

23 An incumbent of a position allocated to the labor service who
24 has been employed less than two years shall be deemed a tenured
25 employee after serving a probationary period.
