AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE RETIREMENT RIGHTS OF CERTAIN EMPLOYEES OF THE MASSACHUSETTS WATER RESOURCES AUTHORITY.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Section 3(g) of Chapter 32 of the Massachusetts General Laws
