AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE INCOME TAX EXEMPTIONS FOR CERTAIN CONTRIBUTORY PENSIONS OF OTHER STATES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Subparagraph (4) of paragraph (a) of said subsection B of
2 section 3 of chapter 62 of the General Laws as appearing in the
3 1988 Official Edition is hereby amended by inserting after the
4 word "subdivision", in line 49 the words: — and provided, that
5 where income from any such fund established under the laws of
6 the commonwealth is partially exempt from taxation in such other
7 state or political subdivision then the income from a contributory
8 annuity, pension, endowment or retirement fund of such other
9 state or political subdivision shall be deductible hereunder, to the
10 same dollar amount as exempted by such other state.
