AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING MOTOR VEHICLE INSURANCE SURCHARGES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 113B of chapter 175 of the General Laws, as appearing
- 2 in the 1990 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after
- 3 the twelfth paragraph the following paragraph: —
- 4 No insurer shall impose an upward premium adjustment for
- 5 surchargeable incidents in accordance with the provision of this
- 6 section upon a person who has appealed such a determination of
- 7 the insurer pursuant to the provisions of section one hundred and
- 8 thirteen P until a final determination of the appeal affirming the
- 9 insurer's determination or until the appeal is withdrawn.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES

As amended by the Thirtieth and Thirty-first Congresses

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES

Article I. Section 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People in each State, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

Section 3. The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature of the State for which they are respectively chosen, and they shall hold their Offices during the Term of their respective Charters, which shall not exceed six Years; and when seated, they shall be sworn or affirm to support the Constitution of the United States.

Section 4. The Times, Places and Manner of holding the Elections of Senators and Representatives, shall be prescribed in each State by the Legislature thereof; but the Congress may at any time by Law make or alter such Regulations, except as to the Places of Elections.
