AN ACT RELATIVE TO STANDARDIZE TREATMENT AND PROGRAMS ACROSS THE STATE AND COUNTY CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 127 of the Massachusetts General Laws, as appearing
2 in the 1994 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding after
3 Section 32, the following section: —
4 Section 32(a). Male and female prisoners and pretrial detainees
5 of state and county correctional institutions shall be treated
6 equally with respect to all prison programs, including education,
7 training, employment, opportunities to earn good time, coun-
8 selling, substance abuse treatment, classification, pre-release,
9 work release, exercise and recreation, visitation, medical care, and
10 discipline. No prisoner or pretrial detainee shall be denied equal
11 access to any prison program or privilege on account of gender.
