The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Ninety-Seven.

AN ACT ALLOWING LIQUOR STORES TO OPEN ON SUNDAYS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 6 of chapter 136 of the General Laws, as last amended
2 by section 316 of Chapter 150 of the acts of 1990, is hereby
3 amended by striking out clause (52) and inserting in place thereof
4 the following new clause: —

5 (52) The retail sale of alcoholic beverages not to be drunk on
6 the premises by retail establishments throughout the common-
7 wealth licensed under section fifteen of chapter one hundred and
8 thirty-eight; provided, however, that a local licensing authority
9 may grant, at its discretion, a permit to allow the sale of alcoholic
10 beverages under this clause; and provided, further, that no such
11 sale shall occur unless such permit has been granted; and provided
12 further, that such permit shall not allow such sale to occur prior to
13 the hour of twelve o'clock noon; and provided, further, that
14 establishments operating under the provisions of this clause shall
15 compensate employees at a rate of not less than one and one-half
16 the employee's regular rate; and provided, further, that no
17 employee shall be required to work, and refusal to work on a
18 Sunday shall not be grounds for discrimination, dismissal,
19 discharge, deduction of hours or any other penalty.
