

By Mr. Broadhurst of Methuen, petition of Arthur J. Broadhurst relative to creditable service for certain unpaid elected municipal officials. Public Service.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Ninety-Seven.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO CREDITABLE SERVICE FOR CERTAIN UNPAID ELECTED MUNICIPAL OFFICIALS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Subdivision (1) of section 4 of chapter 32 of the General Laws,
2 as amended by chapter 197 of the Acts of 1994, is hereby further
3 amended by striking out paragraph (o) and inserting in place
4 thereof the following paragraph: —

5 (o) Any member who served as a selectman, alderman, city
6 councilor or school committee member as the result of election by
7 direct vote of the people, in which position he received no com-
8 pensation, may establish credit for such service by depositing in
9 the annuity savings fund of the system of which he is a member a
10 sum equal to the amount which would have been paid into such
11 fund during such period if such position had been compensated at
12 the rate of twenty-five hundred dollars per year, plus regular
13 interest to the date of payment.
