AN ACT RELATIVE TO MOTOR VEHICLE INSURANCE SURCHARGES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law to
- 2 the contrary, an individual who appeals a motor vehicle insurance
- 3 surcharge shall not be required to pay same prior to the final
- 4 disposition of said appeal.

The first part of the report deals with the general situation of the country.
