The committee on Public Safety, to whom were referred the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1380) of Louis L. Kafka and William R. Keating that the Registrar of Motor Vehicles be authorized to issue one year registrations for certain elderly persons, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1781) of Marie J. Parente, Mary Jane Simmons and Mary Jeanette Murray that the Registrar of Motor Vehicles be directed to make an investigation and study relative to the licensing of persons over age seventy, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2159) of Patrick V. Pappas relative to the issuance of licenses for the operation of motor vehicles for persons trained in cardiopulmonary resuscitation, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2555) of William G. Reinstein relative to the motor vehicle salvage title inspection law of the Commonwealth, and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4063) of Carol A. Donovan that the Registrar of Motor Vehicles be required to maintain certain records of leased vehicles, reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 4410) ought to be adopted.

1     *Ordered*, That the committee on Public Safety be authorized to  
2 sit during a recess of the General Court to make an investigation  
3 and study of House documents numbered 1380, 1781, 2159, 2555,  
4 and 4063 relative to registry of motor vehicles.

5     Said committee shall report to the General Court the results of  
6 its investigation and study, and its recommendations, if any,  
7 together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such recom-  
8 mendations into effect, by filing the same with the Clerk of the  
9 House of Representatives on or before the last Wednesday in  
10 December, nineteen hundred and ninety-seven.
