

wealth from the ordinary revenue, for the salaries and expenses of the board of registration in dentistry, for the fiscal year ending on the thirtieth day of November, nineteen hundred and ten, to wit: —

For the salaries of the members, seventeen hundred dollars. Salaries of members.

For clerical services, postage, printing, travelling and other necessary expenses, to include the printing of the annual report, a sum not exceeding twenty-two hundred dollars. Clerical services, etc.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

AN ACT MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR PAYMENT OF STATE AND MILITARY AID AND EXPENSES IN CONNECTION THEREWITH. Chap. 30

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned are appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury of the commonwealth from the ordinary revenue, for the purposes specified, for the fiscal year ending on the thirtieth day of November, nineteen hundred and ten, to wit: — Appropriations.

For reimbursing cities and towns for money paid on account of state and military aid to Massachusetts volunteers and their families, a sum not exceeding eight hundred and sixty-six thousand dollars, the same to be paid on or before the fifteenth day of November in the year nineteen hundred and ten. State and military aid.

For the salary of the commissioner of state aid and pensions, twenty-five hundred dollars. Salary of commissioner.

For the salary of the deputy commissioner, two thousand dollars. Deputy.

For the salaries of agents, forty-five hundred dollars. Agents.

For the salary of the bookkeeper, thirteen hundred dollars. Bookkeeper.

For the salaries of clerks, a sum not exceeding fifty-four hundred dollars. Clerks.

For incidental and contingent expenses, including necessary travel, a sum not exceeding two thousand and twenty dollars. Expenses.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
