AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE SITING OF A CERTAIN ASPHALT FACILITY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 No asphalt transfer or storage facility shall be located in an area
2 which is less than one-half mile in linear distance from any hos-
3 pital or area occupied by residential housing in Chelsea. Said
4 linear distance shall be measured from the outermost perimeter of
5 such facility to the outermost point of any adjacent hospital zone
6 or residential housing; provided, however, that any such facility in
7 operation as of December first, nineteen hundred and ninety-five
8 shall not be subject to the provisions of this act.
