AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE BOSTON ART CLUB.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*1871, 73, §1,
amended.Boston Art
Club, in-
corporated.

SECTION 1. Section one of chapter seventy-three of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and seventy-one is hereby amended by inserting after the word "library", in the sixth line, the words: — and by other kindred means; to promote social intercourse among, and to afford the conveniences of a club house to, its members, — so as to read as follows: — *Section 1.* Charles C. Perkins, Horace H. Moses, George D. Russell, their associates and successors, are hereby made a corporation by the name of the Boston Art Club, to be located in the city of Boston, for the purpose of advancing the fine arts by the establishment of an art gallery and library, and by other kindred means; to promote social intercourse among, and to afford the conveniences of a club house to, its members; with all the powers and privileges, and subject to all the duties, restrictions and liabilities set forth in all general laws which now are or hereafter may be in force applicable to such corporations.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE BOSTON PROVIDENT ASSOCIATION TO HOLD ADDITIONAL REAL AND PERSONAL ESTATE.

SECTION 1. The Boston Provident Association, incorporated by chapter three hundred and sixty-two of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and fifty-four, is hereby authorized to hold real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding one million dollars.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
