

Chap. 83 AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE ANNUAL REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR OF THE BUREAU OF STATISTICS ON THE STATISTICS OF LABOR.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

§ 3, amended.

SECTION 1. Section three of chapter three hundred and seventy-one of the acts of the year nineteen hundred and nine is hereby amended by striking out the words "Of the report on the statistics of labor, three thousand copies, of which two thousand shall be for the use of the bureau", in the seventeenth, eighteenth and nineteenth lines, and inserting in place thereof the words:— Of the report on the statistics of labor, three thousand five hundred copies, of which two thousand five hundred shall be for the use of the bureau.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

Chap. 84 AN ACT RELATIVE TO MAKING AFFIDAVITS IN POOR DEBTOR PROCEEDINGS.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

amended.

SECTION 1. Section seventy-three of chapter one hundred and sixty-eight of the Revised Laws is hereby amended by adding thereto the words:— All affidavits required under section seventeen of this chapter may be made and sworn to before a clerk or assistant clerk of the courts hereinbefore named, — so as to read as follows:— *Section 73.* All certificates, notices and other processes required by the provisions of this chapter, if issued by a police, district or municipal court having a clerk, shall be under the seal of the court, signed by the clerk or an assistant clerk thereof, and bear teste of a justice of the court who is not an interested party in the proceeding, and, if issued by a court having no clerk or by a trial justice, shall be signed by the magistrate with the designation of his office. All affidavits required under section seventeen of this chapter may be made and sworn to before a clerk or assistant clerk of the courts hereinbefore named.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
