SECTION 7. Nothing in this act contained shall be construed as restricting, enlarging or in any way changing the terms of the bequests or donations under which said estates are devised or given.

Existing trusts not affected.

SECTION 8. This act shall take effect upon its acceptance by said town at a legal meeting duly called for the purpose.

AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROCURING PORTRAITS OF CERTAIN FORMER GOVERNORS OF THE COMMONWEALTH.

Chap.108

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. A sum not exceeding four thousand dollars is hereby appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury of the commonwealth, for the purpose of procuring for the commonwealth portraits of certain former governors, as provided for by section twenty-two of chapter ten of the Revised Laws, to be expended by the governor with the approval of the council.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

AN ACT MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR SALARIES AND EXPENSES IN THE DEPARTMENT OF THE STATE BOARD OF CHARITY, AND FOR SUNDRY CHARITABLE EXPENSES.

Chap.109

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned are appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury of the commonwealth from the ordinary revenue, for the salaries and expenses of the state board of charity, and for sundry charitable expenses, for the fiscal year ending on the thirtieth day of November, nineteen hundred and ten, to wit: —

Appropriations.

STATE BOARD OF CHARITY.

For expenses, including travelling, of members of the board, and for salaries and expenses in the board's central office, a sum not exceeding thirteen thousand dollars.

State board of charity, expenses.

Annual report.	For printing and binding the annual report, a sum not exceeding twenty-two hundred dollars.
Adult poor.	For salaries and expenses in the division of state adult poor, a sum not exceeding fifty thousand seven hundred and fifty dollars.
Minor wards.	For salaries and expenses in the division of state minor wards, a sum not exceeding fifty-eight thousand dollars.
Auxiliary visitors.	For travelling and other necessary expenses of the auxiliary visitors of the board, a sum not exceeding twelve hundred dollars.

MISCELLANEOUS CHARITABLE.

Transportation of state paupers.	For transportation of state paupers under charge of the state board of charity, including transportation of prisoners released on probation from the state farm, and travelling and other expenses of probation visitors, for the present year and for previous years, a sum not exceeding seventeen thousand dollars.
Indigent and neglected children.	For care and maintenance of indigent and neglected children and juvenile offenders, for the present year and for previous years, to include expenses in connection with the same, a sum not exceeding four hundred and five thousand dollars.
Dangerous diseases.	For expenses in connection with smallpox and other diseases dangerous to the public health, for the present year and for previous years, a sum not exceeding sixty thousand dollars.
Tuition of certain children, etc.	For tuition in the public schools, including transportation to and from said schools, of children boarded or bound out by the state board of charity, for the present year and for previous years, a sum not exceeding thirty-five thousand dollars.
Sick state paupers.	For the support of sick state paupers by cities and towns, for the present year and for previous years, the same to include cases of wife settlement, a sum not to exceed seventy-five thousand dollars.
Burial of state paupers.	For the burial of state paupers by cities and towns, for the present year and for previous years, a sum not exceeding seven thousand dollars.
Temporary aid, etc.	For temporary aid furnished to state paupers and shipwrecked seamen by cities and towns, for the present year and for previous years, a sum not exceeding thirty thousand dollars.

For the support and transportation of unsettled pauper infants in this commonwealth, including infants in infant asylums, for the present year and for previous years, a sum not exceeding seventy-two thousand dollars.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE FILING OF CERTIFICATES OF NOMINATION AND NOMINATION PAPERS FOR ELECTIONS IN TOWNS. Chap.110

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. All certificates of nomination for town offices filed on or before the second Saturday, and nomination papers filed on or before the Monday, preceding the election shall, for the year nineteen hundred and ten, be valid.

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE TOWN OF TISBURY TO APPROPRIATE MONEY FOR ADVERTISING THE TOWN AND FOR PUBLIC ENTERTAINMENTS. Chap.111

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. The town of Tisbury may, by a two thirds vote, at its annual town meeting, after due legal notice thereof in the warrants under which said meetings are called, appropriate annually a sum not exceeding five hundred dollars for the purpose of advertising the advantages of the town and for providing amusement or entertainments of a public character.

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE TOWN OF OAK BLUFFS TO APPROPRIATE MONEY FOR ADVERTISING THE TOWN AND FOR PUBLIC AMUSEMENTS. Chap.112

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. The town of Oak Bluffs may, by a two thirds vote, at its annual town meeting, after due legal notice thereof in the warrants under which said meetings are called, annually appropriate a sum not exceeding one
