

For printing, postage and other necessary office expenses, including the printing and binding of the annual report, a sum not exceeding six thousand dollars. Office expenses.

For rent of offices, a sum not exceeding forty-seven hundred and fifty dollars. Rent of offices.

For care and repair of road-building machinery, a sum not exceeding three thousand dollars. Road-building machinery.

For the maintenance of state highways, for the present year and for previous years, a sum not exceeding two hundred thousand dollars. Maintenance of highways.

For the suppression of the gypsy and brown tail moths in state highways, a sum not exceeding ten thousand dollars. Suppression of gypsy and brown tail moths.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE TENURE OF OFFICE OF MEMBERS OF THE POLICE FORCE OF THE CITY OF WORCESTER. Chap.140

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. Chapter three hundred and sixty of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and eighty-eight, entitled, "An Act to fix the tenure of office of members of the police force of the city of Worcester", is hereby repealed. Repeal.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

AN ACT TO PROHIBIT THE USE OF FIRE BALLOONS. Chap.141

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

It shall be unlawful within any city or town in this commonwealth for any person to liberate or fly fire balloons of any description. Whoever violates this act shall be punished by a fine of not more than one hundred dollars, or by imprisonment for not more than one month, or by both such fine and imprisonment. To prohibit the use of fire balloons.

AN ACT MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE SALARIES AND EXPENSES OF THE HARBOR AND LAND COMMISSIONERS. Chap.142

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned are appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury of the commonwealth from the ordinary revenue, for the harbor and land com- Appropriations.

missioners, for the fiscal year ending on the thirtieth day of November, nineteen hundred and ten, to wit:—

For the salaries of the commissioners, eighty-seven hundred dollars.

For the compensation and expenses of engineers, and for clerical and other assistance, a sum not exceeding thirty-three thousand dollars.

Travelling

For travelling and other necessary expenses, a sum not exceeding seven hundred and fifty dollars.

Office  
expenses.

For incidental and contingent office expenses, to include the printing and binding of the annual report, a sum not exceeding two thousand dollars.

Town bound-  
ary atlases.

For printing town boundary atlases, a sum not exceeding two thousand dollars.

Inspection of  
town boundary  
marks.

For expenses of the examination and inspection of all monuments or other marks defining the boundary lines of the commonwealth, a sum not exceeding fifteen hundred dollars.

Protection  
of rivers,  
harbors, etc.

For the improvement and protection of rivers, harbors, tide waters and foreshores, a sum not exceeding one hundred thousand dollars.

Surveys of  
harbors, etc.

For surveys of harbors, for improving and preserving the same, and for repairing damages occasioned by storms along the coast line or river banks of the commonwealth, a sum not exceeding four thousand dollars.

Removal  
of wrecks.

For the removal of wrecks and other obstructions from tide waters, a sum not exceeding two thousand dollars.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

**Chap. 143** AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE USE OF BUILDINGS AS THEATRES  
AND PUBLIC HALLS.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

Section two of chapter three hundred and thirty-five of the acts of the year nineteen hundred and eight is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof the words:— The license granted under the provisions of chapter one hundred and five of the acts of the year nineteen hundred and six shall expire on the first day of June of each year, — so as to read as follows:— *Section 2.* Any licensee who violates the conditions of a license granted by the chief of the district police in accordance with the provisions of chapter
