AN ACT RELATIVE TO DISABLED PERSONS EXEMPTIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 5, Cl. (50) of Chapter 59 of the General
2 Laws, as appearing in the 2000 Official Edition, is hereby
3 amended in line three by adding after the word "old":— "or a
4 person who is certified by a physician as permanently disabled".
