AN ACT RELATIVE TO MINORS AND MOTION PICTURES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 272 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 1998
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after section 32
3 the following:—
4 Section 32A. Whoever knowingly disseminates to a person
5 under 17 years of age a motion picture film, videotape, or video
6 disc with a restricted rating, which requires a person under 17
7 years of age to be accompanied by a parent or adult guardian,
8 shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$1000, unless the
9 person under 17 years of age is accompanied by a parent or adult
10 guardian.
