AN ACT RELATIVE TO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 2 of Chapter 138 of the General Laws, as  
2 appearing in the 1998 Official Edition, is hereby amended by  
3 adding after the words , “provided in section”, in line 32, the  
4 following words: Eighteen C and section.

1 SECTION 2. Section 18B of Chapter 138 of the General Laws,  
2 as appearing in the 1998 Official Edition, is hereby amended by  
3 adding after Section 18B, the following new section:

4 “Section 18C. Any person who manufactures with intent to sell  
5 or is in the business of selling alcoholic beverages in another state  
6 or country who knowingly and intentionally ships or causes to be  
7 shipped any alcoholic beverage to any resident of this state, other  
8 than a license under Section 18 or as otherwise provided in this  
9 chapter, shall be punished by a fine not to exceed ten thousand  
10 dollars, or by imprisonment in a state correctional facility for not  
11 more than one year or both.”

1 SECTION 3. Section 22 of Chapter 138 of the General Laws,  
2 as appearing in the 1998 Official Edition, is further amended in  
3 the sixth paragraph after the words “granted under this section.”,  
4 in line 37, by adding the following:

5 “provided that any individual, partnership, or corporation who  
6 holds a permit granted by the commission under this section for  
7 the purpose of delivering alcoholic beverages or wine to a con-

8 sumer within the Commonwealth shall not complete such deliv-  
9 eries unless the recipient of the delivery, at the time of the  
10 delivery, shows proof by way of valid identification that said  
11 recipient is twenty-one years of age or older. Any alcoholic bever-  
12 ages, malt beverages, or wine shipped under the provisions of this  
13 section shall be marked, "This package contains alcohol. Proof of  
14 identification that recipient is twenty-one years of age or older is  
15 required for delivery".
