AN ACT RELATIVE TO POLICE MANAGEMENT RIGHTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The first paragraph of Section 7(d) of Chapter 150E, as most
2 recently amended, is hereby further amended by deleting the
3 words “or of a police commissioner or other head of a police or
4 public safety department of a municipality” and replacing them
5 with the words “the regulations of a police commissioner or other
6 head of a police or public safety department of a municipality,
7 except insofar as such regulations pertain to matters of assign-
8 ments, deployment, staffing, discipline, organization, government,
9 training, rank structure, duties and responsibilities, determination
10 of fitness for duty including the right to carry a weapon, determi-
11 nation of uniforms and equipment, and development and imple-
12 mentation of operational and administrative policies;”.
