AN ACT RELATIVE TO AFFORDABLE HOUSING.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, any
2 person who develops low and moderate rental housing, not subject
3 to section 20 to 23, inclusive of chapter 40B of the General Laws,
4 shall be entitled to a tax credit equal to 10 per cent of the value of
5 such housing. The credit may come from an income tax credit, a
6 corporate tax credit or a real property tax credit; provided, how-
7 ever, that not more than ½ shall come from each credit. For the
8 purposes of this section, low and moderate rental housing shall
9 mean decent, safe and sanitary dwelling units whether the finan-
10 cial real of families or elderly of low or moderate income and
11 developed and administered to promote serviceability, efficiency,
12 economy and stability; together with all necessary appurtenances
13 of such dwellings.
