AN ACT RELATIVE TO INSURANCE COMPANY BILLING REQUIREMENTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 175 Section 47 of the Massachusetts General Laws is
2 hereby amended by adding at the end thereof the following:

3 47M Publication of copayments by insurers.

4 Any company authorized to issue policies of contracts,
5 agreements, plans or certificates of insurance for coverage of
6 health care services, including any self-insured sickness, health or
7 welfare plan issued within or without the Commonwealth and
8 including, but not limited to, those of a non-profit medical service
9 corporation organized pursuant to chapter one hundred and
10 seventy-six B, an insurance company licensed pursuant to chapter
11 one hundred seventy-six G and any preferred provider
12 organization organized pursuant to chapter one hundred seventy-
13 six I, shall be required to include as part of any and all invoices
14 to each insured who resides in the Commonwealth of
15 Massachusetts a regular and cumulative tabulation of all
16 copayments made by said insured for the year in which the policy,
17 contract, agreement or certificate is in effect.

18 The Commissioner of Insurance shall promulgate regulations
19 to enforce the provisions of this Section.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES

As amended by the Thirteenth, Fourteenth, Fifteenth, and Nineteenth Amendments

Approved by the Senate and House of Representatives on September 17, 1787

1. We the People of the United States, in Order to form a more perfect Union, establish Justice, insure domestic Tranquillity, provide for the common defence, promote the general Welfare, and secure the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our Posterity, do hereby ordain and establish this Constitution for the United States of America.
2. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.
3. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.
4.
