The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Ninety-Four.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR AN ADVISORY BOARD ON REGIONALISM FOR EACH COUNTY ACCEPTING THIS SECTION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 34 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by inserting after section 14B, inserted by Chapter 197
3 of the Acts of 1987, the following section: —

4 Section 14C. In any county which accepts this section by vote
5 of the county commissioners, the chairman of the county
6 commissioners shall appoint five members to an advisory board
7 on regionalism. Each member to be appointed to a three year term.
8 The first appointment to have staggered terms of one year, two
9 years, and three years. The purpose of this advisory board in
10 regionalism is to advise their county how cooperation between the
11 county and cities and towns may be accomplished.

1 SECTION 2. Members of the advisory boards shall serve
2 without compensation.
