AN ACT TO AMEND CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF THE GENERAL LAWS RELATING TO MECHANICS LIENS FOR LABOR AND MATERIALS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 2 of Chapter 254 of the Massachusetts
2 General Laws, as appearing in the 1992 Official Edition, is hereby
3 amended as follows:— by adding, in line 9, after the word
4 “notice” the words:— must be filed within 65 days of the contract
5 completion date and; by adding, in line 17, after the word “is” the
6 words:— or was.

1 SECTION 2. Section 4 of Chapter 254 of the Massachusetts
2 General Laws, as appearing in the 1992 Official Edition, is hereby
3 amended as follows:— by adding, in line 18, after the word
4 “notice,” the words:— within 65 days of the contract completion
5 date,.

1 SECTION 3. Section 8 of Chapter 254 of the Massachusetts
2 General Laws, as appearing in the 1992 Official Edition, is hereby
3 amended as follows:— by striking, in lines 3 and 4, the words
4 “principal contract is to be performed” and inserting in place
5 thereof the following words:— notice of contract is filed, as pro-
6 vided in Sections 2 and 4 of this Chapter,.
