AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A CITIZENS MILITARY TRAINING CORPS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 The department of education is hereby authorized and directed
- 2 to establish and maintain a Citizens Military Training Corps on
- 3 the site of Fort Devens in the town of Ayer. It shall be the purpose
- 4 and aim of such school to teach application, discipline, duty and
- 5 patriotism to our youth. Said department shall adopt rules and reg-
- 6 ulations to carry out the intent of this act.
