AN ACT RELATIVE TO CIVIL SERVICE PREFERENCE OF CERTAIN MEMBERS OF THE FAMILY OF LIEUTENANT RAYMOND McNAMARA FOR APPOINTMENT TO THE FIRE SERVICE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of section
2 twenty-six of chapter thirty-one of the General Laws or any other
3 general or special law to the contrary, the sons of Raymond
4 McNamara, a fire lieutenant of the City of Newton who was
5 severely burned in the performance of his duty at a fire and explo-
6 sion on the twenty-fifth day of October, 1993, who passes the
7 required written and physical examinations for entrance to the fire
8 service shall have his name certified for original appointment to
9 the fire service before all other persons on the eligible list for such
10 appointment; provided, however, that if more than one person is
11 deemed to be eligible pursuant to the provisions of this act, the
12 names of such persons shall be certified in the order of their
13 respective scores on the open competitive civil service examina-
14 tion for such fire service.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
