AN ACT RELATIVE TO CERTAIN PARK LAND IN THE CITY OF HOLYOKE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law to
2 the contrary the parks and recreation commission of the city of
3 Holyoke is hereby authorized to transfer the care, custody,
4 management and control of a certain parcel of land, in the city of
5 Holyoke, hereinafter described, currently used as park land, to the
6 city council of Holyoke:

7 Land located at the corner of Commercial Street and Sargeant
8 Street, described in the Holyoke assessor's records as map 10,
9 block 3, Parcel 1, containing approximately nine thousand square
10 feet, and as more particularly described in an order of taking by
11 the city of Holyoke dated September 29, 1971 and recorded in the
12 Hampden county registry of deeds in book 3628, page 581.

THE UNIVERSITY OF TORONTO

IN SENATE

Resolved, That the following be adopted as the

constitution of the University of Toronto

Section 1. The University of Toronto shall be a body corporate with perpetual succession and shall have the right to acquire, hold, dispose of, and alienate real and personal property, and to sue and be sued in its corporate name.
