AN ACT RELATIVE TO MINIMUM PRICING FOR CIGARETTES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 13 of Chapter 64C of the General Laws, as
2 most recently amended by Section 140 of Chapter 286 of the Acts
3 of 1992, is hereby amended in clause (b) by striking the words
4 “twelve and four tenths per centum . . .” and inserting in place
5 thereof the words “twenty-five per centum. . .”

1 SECTION 2. Section 13 of Chapter 64C of the General Laws, as
2 most recently amended by Section 140 of Chapter 286 of the Acts
3 of 1992, is hereby amended in clause (d) by striking the words
4 “twelve and four tenths per centum . . .” and inserting in place
