AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE LICENSING OF BOXING.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section thirty-two of chapter one hundred and forty-seven of the
2 General Laws, as most recently amended by chapter two hundred
3 and sixty-two, Acts of 1935, is hereby further amended by deleting
4 the last sentence and inserting in place thereof the following two
5 sentences: — In the case of exhibitions or bouts held in accordance
6 with the rules and regulations of such amateur organizations as
7 may be approved by the commission, the commission may issue
8 special licenses without the requirement of a bond as provided in
9 section thirty-four. Each application for a special license shall be
10 accompanied by a fee, not exceeding fifty dollars, as the commis-
11 sion may establish.
