The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE ESCHEAT OF UNCLAIMED CHECKS IN THE EMINENT DOMAIN TRUST FUND OF THE COMMONWEALTH.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 79 of the General Laws is hereby amend-
2 ed by striking out in the second sentence the words (7D) and insert
3 thereof the following words: —

4 (7D) provided, however, that any political subdivision entitled
5 to receive an amount awarded as damages in any order of taking,
6 and which sum is deposited in said eminent domain trust fund as
7 provided hereunder, which fails to reclaim said amount two (2)
8 years after deposit thereof, shall thereupon escheat to the common-
9 wealth.

1 SECTION 2. With respect to all unclaimed checks which have
2 been deposited in said fund prior to the effective date of the act, any
3 political subdivision having a claim may reclaim the same within
4 two (2) years after the effective date of this act.
