AN ACT RELATIVE TO MUNICIPAL SERVICE BY CERTAIN TEACHERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 6A of chapter 39 of the General Laws, as
2 recently amended by chapter 731 of the Acts of 1963, is hereby
3 amended by striking out the first sentence and inserting therein the
4 following sentence: —

5 Notwithstanding the provisions of any city charter to the con-
6 trary the mayor and the members of the city council, or other
7 legislative body of a city, shall receive for their services such salary
8 as the city council or other legislative body of said city shall by
9 ordinance determine, and shall receive no other compensation
10 from the city except that a member of a city council or other
11 legislative body of a city may serve as a teacher or principal in said
12 city may be paid for same.

1 SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the con-
2 trary a teacher or principal may serve as a selectman in the town
3 which he is employed as a teacher or principal and may receive the
4 customary compensation paid for each position.
