### AN ACT INCLUDING MEMBERS OF A FIRE FORCE UNDER WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 69 of chapter 152 of the General Laws, as most recently  
2 amended by chapter 1059 of the acts of 1971, is hereby amended by  
3 striking in the first paragraph on lines 41-42 the words "except  
4 members of a fire force"; on line 44 the words "except members of a  
5 fire force"; and on line 55 by striking the words "fire force".
