By Messrs. Buglione of Methuen and Lussier of Pittsfield, petition of Nicholas J. Buglione, Thomas R. Lussier and David B. Cohen that provision be made for the employment of persons to construct examinations by the Division of Personnel Administration. Public Service.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE EMPLOYMENT OF PERSONS TO CONSTRUCT EXAMINATIONS BY THE DIVISION OF PERSONNEL ADMINISTRATION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 31 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding
2 after Section 16 the following Section 16A:—

3 16A. Notwithstanding any provision of Chapter 268A or of any
4 other law, the personnel administrator may employ persons out-
5 side of or in the classified civil service of the commonwealth, or of
6 any city or town where chapter thirty-one is in force, who shall,
7 with the consent of the head of the department or office in which
8 any such person in said classified civil service serves, assist in the
9 construction or validation of examinations for any public employ-
10 ment and perform such other duties as may be required by said
11 administrator.

12 Notwithstanding any provision of section ninety-one of chapter
13 thirty-two to the contrary, the personnel administrator may reem-
14 ploy a former examiner who is retired from the service of the
15 commonwealth or any of its political subdivisions to assist with the
16 construction of examinations and perform such other duties as
17 may be required by said administrator. Such reemployment shall
18 not affect the pension or retirement rights or amount of pension or

19 retirement allowance of any person reemployed as an examiner;
 20 provided, that the total annual compensation received for such
 21 reemployment as an examiner does not exceed five thousand
 22 dollars.

1 Chapter 11 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding
 2 the section in the following set on 18A.
 3 18A. (a) Any person who is employed by the State or any
 4 city or town whose duties are of a technical nature shall
 5 be eligible for reemployment as an examiner if he or she
 6 has been employed by the State or any city or town for
 7 a period of not less than one year immediately preceding
 8 his or her termination of employment. Such reemployment
 9 shall be for a period of not more than one year, and the
 10 total compensation received for such reemployment shall
 11 not exceed five thousand dollars. The total annual
 12 compensation received for such reemployment shall not
 13 exceed the total annual compensation received for such
 14 reemployment as an examiner. The total annual compensation
 15 received for such reemployment as an examiner shall not
 16 exceed five thousand dollars. The total annual compensation
 17 received for such reemployment as an examiner shall not
 18 exceed five thousand dollars.
