AN ACT PLACING CERTAIN CORRECTIONAL EMPLOYEES IN GROUP 4 OF THE CONTRIBUTORY RETIREMENT SYSTEM.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Paragraph (g) of subdivision 2 of section 3 of Chapter 32 of the
2 General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the following
3 definition: —

4 Group 4.—Division of law enforcement, office of the secretary
5 of the executive office of environmental affairs; officials and
6 employees of the registry of motor vehicles appointed by the
7 registrar under section twenty-nine of chapter ninety; capitol
8 police; members of the state police detectives appointed under
9 section six of chapter twenty-two, serving in any division of the
10 department of public safety; members of the police force of the
11 metropolitan district commission; employees of the Massachusetts
12 Port Authority at the General Edward Lawrence Logan Interna-
13 tional Airport, comprising permanent crash crewman, fire control
14 men, assistant fire control men; members of police and fire depart-
15 ments not classified in Group 1; any police officer of the Massachu-
16 setts Bay Transportation Authority; employees whose regular
17 compensation is paid by the United States from funds allocated to
18 the Massachusetts National Guard and who are regularly and
19 permanently employed under the control of the military depart-
20 ment of the commonwealth and whose duties in such employment
21 require substantially all normal working hours and whose con-

22 tinued employment is based upon federal recognition in the Massa-
23 chusetts National Guard; employees of a municipal gas or electric
24 generating or distribution plant who are employed as linemen,
25 electric switchboard operators, electric maintenance men, steam
26 engineers, boiler operators, firemen, oilers, mechanical mainte-
27 nance men, and supervisors of said employees; employees of the
28 department of correction who are employed at any correctional
29 institution or prison camp under the control of said department
30 and who hold the position of correction officer, female correction
31 officer, industrial instructor, recreation officer, assistant industrial
32 shop manager, industrial shop manager, assistant to the supervisor
33 of industries, supervisor of industries, senior correction officer,
34 senior female correction officer, supervising correction officer,
35 prison camp officer, senior prison camp officer, supervising prison
36 camp officer, assistant deputy superintendent or supervising ident-
37 tification agent, correctional social worker, head correctional
38 social worker, correctional psychiatric social worker, head correc-
39 tional psychiatric social worker, head social worker supervisor,
40 senior counselor, counselor, supervisor of education, assistant
41 supervisor of education, principal of institutional school, head
42 teacher of institutional school, institutional school teacher, institu-
43 tional shop instructor, and librarian, employees who hold the
44 position of state hospital steward in the department of correction;
45 the sheriff, master, deputy master, assistant deputy master and
46 correction officers of county correctional facilities; the chief fire
47 warden and district fire wardens in the executive office of environ-
48 mental affairs.
