

By Mr. Dwinell of Millbury, petition of Richard J. Dwinell that certain temporary non-civil service positions and incumbent employees of the Department of Environmental Management be made permanent. Public Service.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty.

AN ACT THAT CERTAIN TEMPORARY NON-CIVIL SERVICE POSITIONS AND INCUMBENT EMPLOYEES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT BE MADE PERMANENT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any general or special laws to the contrary, or
2 any rule or regulation of the Department, those year-round em-
3 ployees of the Rink and Pool program of the Division of Forests
4 and Parks who on or before January 1 of 1980 complete three
5 years of service in the Rink & Pool Program, including those
6 periods in which they may have been promoted to a position
7 outside of the program, shall have the position in which they are an
8 incumbent on January 1, 1980, made permanent and they be made
9 permanent in said position and both the position and incumbent
10 henceforth shall be subject to the provisions of Chapter 31. All
11 such employees affected by this Act shall suffer no impairment of
12 their present civil service status, if any, and seniority, retirement
13 and other rights, interruption of service or reduction in compensa-
14 tion or salary grade. The rights of all such employees under collec-
15 tive bargaining agreements shall be preserved and protected.

16 For the purposes of this Act, year-round employees shall mean
17 those employees on the Department's payroll for at least fifty-two
18 weeks of the calendar year.
