AN ACT TO PROTECT A PERSON WHO IS EQUIPPED WITH A "PACEMAKER",
FROM ANY ELECTRICAL DEVICE ELECTRICALLY OR BATTERY
POWERED.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General
Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Any installation or building equipped with such type of
- 2 operating device shall warn such persons equipped with a "Pace-
- 3 Maker" of the dangers involved from said devices.
- 4 A sign or signs shall be placed in conspicuous locations to warn
- 5 the person equipped with a "Pace-Maker".
