

HOUSE No. 3074

By Mr. Cerasoli of Quincy, petition of Robert A. Cerasoli that military service performed by certain employees be counted as creditable service for purposes of retirement. Public Service.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT MILITARY SERVICE PERFORMED BY CERTAIN EMPLOYEES BE COUNTED AS CREDITABLE SERVICE FOR PURPOSES OF RETIREMENT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Paragraph (h) of subdivision (1) section 4 of Chapter 32 of the
2 General Laws, as most recently amended by Chapter 671 of the
3 Acts of 1966, is hereby further amended by adding after the third
4 subparagraph, the following new subparagraph: — Any member
5 who served in the armed services between December seventh,
6 nineteen hundred and forty-one and July first, nineteen hundred
7 and forty-six, and who was honorably discharged, shall have
8 actual service credited to him as creditable service provided that he
9 is a veteran as defined in section (1) having not less than twenty
10 years accumulative service in the commonwealth or any of its
11 political subdivisions and that he pay into the annuity savings fund
12 of the state retirement system such amounts as he would have
13 contributed during the period of such service, but in no event for
14 more than four years.
