AN ACT AUTHORIZING PAYMENT OF CURRENT CHARGES UNDER WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION ACT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 32 of chapter 6A of the General Laws as most recently
2 amended by Chapter 409 of the Acts of 1976 is hereby amended by
3 striking clause (4) in the third paragraph and inserting in place
4 thereof the following:

5 "(4) shall determine after a public hearing at least as often as
6 annually, and certify to the division of industrial accidents of the
7 department of labor and industries, rates of payment for general
8 health supplies, care, social rehabilitative or educational services
9 and accommodations, which rates shall be paid for services under
10 the workmen's compensation act; such rates shall be the most
11 current charges as approved by the commission for the hospital
12 pursuant to section 37 through 47 inclusive of this chapter."
