AN ACT EXEMPTING VACATION AND RECREATIONAL RENTALS FROM THE PROVISIONS OF THE TENANT SECURITY DEPOSIT LAW.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 15B of chapter 186 of the General Laws, inserted by
2 chapter 553 of the acts of 1978, is hereby amended by adding after
3 clause (8) thereof the following additional clause:—

4 (9) The provisions of this section shall not apply to any lease,
5 rental, occupancy or tenancy of one hundred days or less in dura-
6 tion which is of a vacation or recreational character.

Article I, Section 8, Clause 3
