AN ACT RELATIVE TO CERTAIN CHARGES ASSESSED BY ELECTRIC UTILITIES FOR NUCLEAR POWER INSTALLATION.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 69G of chapter 164 of the General Laws is  
2 hereby amended by inserting after the definition "council" the  
3 following: — "Decommissioning" — shall mean removing a nu-  
4 clear installation from service at the end of its useful lifetime and in  
5 some manner disposing of the nuclear equipment and all related  
6 materials and substances while ensuring that there are no adverse  
7 impacts on the public and the environment.

1 SECTION 2. Said section 69G is hereby further amended by  
2 inserting after the definition, "Synthetic natural gas" the following  
3 new definition: —  
4 "Utility Company" — includes any group, corporation, person  
5 or entity that engages in the generation or distribution of electric  
6 power. The Department of Public Utilities shall order any utility  
7 company operating a nuclear installation to develop comprehen-  
8 sive plans for decommissioning nuclear installations. Further-  
9 more, the charges for all aspects of decommissioning shall be  
10 included in the cost of service, operating expenses or any consum-  
11 er-sponsored charges.
