

HOUSE No. 3964

By Mr. Fallon of Clinton, petition of Thomas F. Fallon for legislation to provide for the appointment of a chief court officer in the First District Court of Northern Middlesex. The Judiciary.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF A CHIEF COURT OFFICER
IN THE FIRST DISTRICT COURT OF NORTHERN MIDDLESEX.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 62 of chapter 218 of the General Laws is hereby amended
2 by striking out the second paragraph and inserting in place thereof
3 the following paragraph: —

4 In the municipal court of the Roxbury district and in the municipi-
5 pal court of the Dorchester district, one court officer shall be
6 designated by the first justice of each said court as chief court
7 officer and one as assistant chief court officer. In the district court
8 of Chelsea, the first district court of Northern Middlesex, and in
9 the East Boston district court, one court officer shall be designated
10 by the justice of said court as chief court officer. In the Boston
11 juvenile court, one court officer shall be designated by the justice of
12 said court as chief court officer, and two as assistant chief court
13 officers.
