AN ACT PROHIBITING THE ENACTMENT OF NEW LEGISLATION AFFECTING CITIES AND TOWNS WITHOUT ADEQUATE FUNDING BY THE COMMONWEALTH.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The general court shall not enact any legislation
2 affecting cities and towns without adequate funding of said legisla-
3 tion being provided by the commonwealth.

1 SECTION 2. No funds available to cities and towns on the
2 effective date of this act shall be used to fund any such legislation
3 enacted after the effective date of this act.
