AN ACT PROHIBITING THE OPERATION OF MOTOR VEHICLES CARRYING HAZARDOUS GASES FROM THE HIGHWAYS OF THE COMMONWEALTH DURING CERTAIN PERIODS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 90 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting
2 after section 19E the following section: —

3 *Section 19F.* No motor vehicles, trailer, semi-trailer or semi-
4 trailer unit carrying hazardous gases may be operated or permitted
5 to operate on the highways of the commonwealth between the
6 hours of seven o'clock in the morning through nine o'clock in the
7 morning, or between the hours of four o'clock in the afternoon and
8 six o'clock in the evening.
