

# HOUSE . . . . . No. 4019

By Mr. Cohen of Andover, petition of Gerald M. Cohen, Robert C. Buell and others (by vote of the town) for legislation to provide that the position of custodian in the school department of the town of Andover be exempt from provisions of the civil service law and rules. Public Safety. [Local Approval Received.]

## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT THE POSITION OF CUSTODIAN IN THE SCHOOL DEPARTMENT OF THE TOWN OF ANDOVER SHALL BE EXEMPT FROM THE PROVISIONS OF THE CIVIL SERVICE LAW AND RULES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The position of custodian in the school depart-  
2 ment of the town of Andover shall not be subject to the provisions  
3 of chapter thirty-one of the General Laws.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall be submitted for acceptance to the  
2 voters in the town of Andover at its next annual town meeting in  
3 the form of the following question which shall be placed on the  
4 official ballot to be used for the election of town officers at said  
5 meeting: — “Shall an act passed by the General Court in the year  
6 nineteen hundred and seventy-nine, entitled ‘An Act providing that  
7 the position of custodian in the school department of the town of  
8 Andover shall be exempt from the provisions of the civil service  
9 law and rules’, be accepted?” If a majority of the votes in answer to  
10 said question is in the affirmative, then this act shall thereupon take  
11 full force and effect, but not otherwise.
